
Visit of Minister of Social Development

I also remember the first core member that we welcomed. His name was Hilmi and it was a precious time when he arrived. He was not just a guy that we welcomed, he was a part of our family.

What is one of your most beautiful memories at Ma'an?

I have so many beautiful memories during my time at Ma'an Lil-Hayat. I experienced humanity, love, friendship and family. I wasn't only here to help and be an assistant but I was part of a family.

One of the most beautiful memories I had was a bit painful. It was my friendship with Sana'. I considered her like my daughter and I used to invite her to my house all the time. Her presence in life was important and when she passed away, I felt like a piece of me died with her. However, I'm happy that I got to experience life with her with happiness, joy and love. She left a mark on me and my perspective on life and how I see disability.
